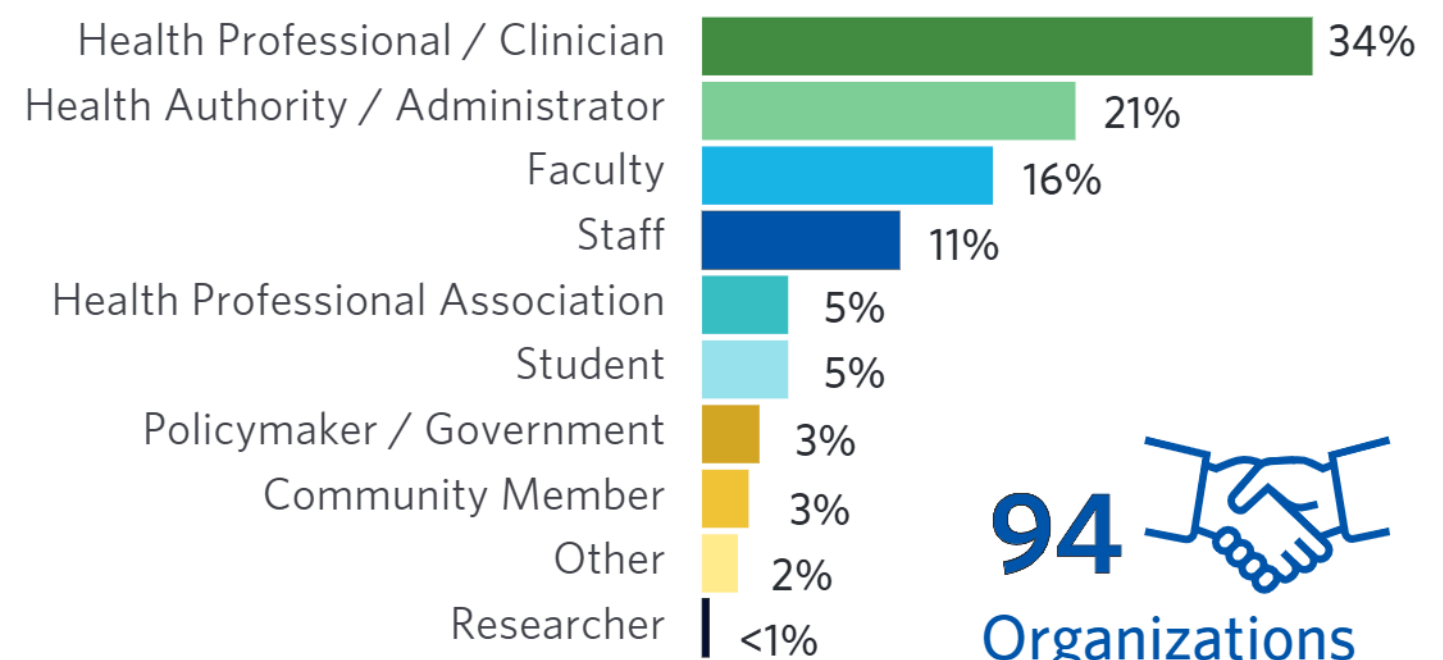

EMERGING QUESTIONS AND THEMES¹

How do we shift the culture of a primary care team from 'treatment as usual' to integrated primary care?



Practice Innovation

Interdisciplinary and interprofessional research takes longer but is important to develop. What can promote more interdisciplinary approaches to researching healthcare issues and teams?



Challenges in Learning, Practice, and Implementation
